






## The participation age

From September 2015 the participation age was increased until the young person's 18th birthday. This does not mean staying in school, you can opt to study or train in any of the following ways:

- · Studying full time in school, college or with any training provider
- · Working or volunteering, combined with a part-time education or training
- · Apprenticeship, traineeship or study programme

The government have decided to do this because it is widely recognised that if a young person stays in education or training they will have better career prospects.



GCSE or equivalent grades 1 - 3 are called Level 1 Qualifications.

GCSE or equivalent grades 4 - 9 are called Level 2 Qualifications.

To progress to Level 3, then students will need to have the Level 2 qualification first.

Students must secure English and Maths at Level 2 or they will need to continue studying these post-16.



# Necessary







### English

You will ALL do English language AND English Literature





#### Maths

You will ALL do Maths







#### Science

You will ALL do Science – but there are two different ways you might do it.

- 1. Combined Science (you get TWO GCSE grades)
- 2. Separates (you get THREE grades, one each for Physics, Biology and Chemistry)

You do not need to choose- your teachers will decide which is appropriate for you





#### PE

You will ALL do PE – but you have several options as to how much you do.

- 1. Core PE (2 periods a week, just physical activity **no qualification gained**)
- 2. Sport (Vocational) as an <u>extra</u> qualification (2 periods a week combination of physical activity and classroom work)
- 3. Sport (Vocational) option <u>plus</u> Core PE (4.5 periods total per week)
- 4. GCSE PE plus Core PE (4.5 periods total per week)





### Personal Development

You will ALL do Personal Development – but you will not gain a qualification

### Academic subjects

These are subjects that will allow you to do tasks and think about ways of working that support further study at sixth form and university





#### Humanities

ALL of you will do History OR Geography





### Languages

MANY of you will do Languages





#### Vocational subjects

You SHOULD pick at least one vocational subject

These are subjects that will allow you to do tasks and think about ways of working that have more direct links to the workplace





#### Creative subjects

These are subjects that will allow you to do tasks and think about ways of working that are more independent and creative
